Kol Nidre Sermon 5785: A World Turned Upside-Down Rabbi Eric Yanoff

[Start in a headstand – with help!] – **G'mar Tov (x2)...** People help me up for Aleinu, but.... Some hagbah!...

And *thaaaaaat's* enough of that for me... though the perspective is... *refreshing*.... You should know, I'm not the first Jewish leader to try to understand our world by standing on my head. Most famously **[POSTER]**, David Ben Gurion believed in the health benefits of standing on his head – for long periods of time (*much longer than I could do it – and without help!*).

It makes me wonder: In *addition* to his health reasons – maybe Ben Gurion *also* spent so much time on his head because he was trying to see the world... *correctly*. He lived in a tumultuous time – and coming out of Holocaust, maybe the only way he could envision a *better* world, when *HIS* world was *SO* upside down, was to flip himself, to see it better, to see the upside-down world... *right-side up*....



From a Jewish perspective – it's not so crazy: The full name of this sacred day is *not* "Yom Kippur" – but "Yom HaKippurim" – which has been interpreted as *[POSTERS]* "Yom... <u>k'PURIM</u> – A day like Purim." You know Purim – the crazy Jewish holiday, when we laugh and shake our heads at a world turned upside-down. The words in the Megillah we read on Purim summarize this feeling – we read "*v'nahafoch hu*" – our fate was all upended, turned on its head. Mordechai and the Jews were *meant* to be annihilated; instead, we are celebrated – and vice versa for Haman... Haman... (*BOO!*) and his followers.





Ben Gurion saw a world upside-down – and asked: What do we do? He changed Jewish history – building the Modern State of Israel, enabling Jews to determine our own fate and path for the first time in two millennia. *Not bad*.... But for *US*, in our current mess: What do we do with a world upside-down?

Well, the **first step** is that we must **acknowledge** that the world IS, indeed, upside-down. It reminds me of a story by the Chassidic Rebbe, **Reb Nachman** – the story of the **Tainted Wheat**... In which a King's advisor comes to him, in a panic. He says, "This year's **harvest** of wheat is **tainted**! Anyone who eats bread from this wheat will go **insane**! But *without* the wheat, we will all **starve**! What should we do?" The King calmly asks: "Is there **any** of the **old wheat**, from *last* year's harvest, left?" - to which the advisor responds: "Yes, but **only enough for two people** to last until the next harvest."

The King nods: "Fine – then you and I will eat bread from the old wheat." The excitable advisor balks: "But if everyone else is insane – how will we convince them that WE'RE the sane ones, an island in a sea of insanity? They will revolt against us! And we may even start doubting *ourselves*, with such overwhelming noise of insanity! What shall we do?" To which the King advises, "Here's what we'll do: We'll each put a mark on one another's forehead – the *one place* on our bodies where another person can see it while facing us, but we cannot – and *when I look at you, and you look at me* – we'll be reminded, re-affirmed, reassured that we're not crazy, but that <u>WE</u> are the ones who must lead the world back to rightside-up."

Right now, in our world – I think *that's* our **biggest danger**: That we **might get OKAY** with **how upside-down** the world is right now. That we **might fail to RECOGNIZE how messed up** things are. We must **constantly push** *against* **complacency** or **acceptance** – and **remind** ourselves: It **doesn't have to be like this**. We can do better.

And isn't THAT the **purpose** of **Yom Kippur**? To **REMIND ourselves** – to **REMIND** the **WORLD** – that we are off-course. EVERY YEAR, we acknowledge it: We say – WE ARE NOT OKAY. WE NEED FIXING. So much so – that right now, <u>as</u> **THIS Yom Kippur** is just beginning – I *already* have on my calendar, NEXT Yom Kippur: It's the 10th of Tishrei, 5786 – mark it down – next Kol Nidre is October 1, 2025. We just sang in the Kol Nidre prayer: "*Mi-Yom Kippurim zeh, ad Yom Kippurim ha-ba aleinu*" – from this Yom Kippur until next Yom Kippur" - I KNOW, <u>right now</u> – that we're going to need another fix, another tune-up, by next year!

So THAT's the **IMPORTANT FIRST STEP** – to **call it out**, to **recognize** that the world is upside- down. So I'll ask: Is there anyone here who does *NOT* believe that, in some way, the world is on its head?!

Let's look at the evidence that we're upside-down – let's see those marks on one another's foreheads, to remind us that the world around us is topsy-turvy:

First of all – on a **lighter note**: the world is upside-down when I can say this, for the **first time** in **history**: The **Washington Commanders** are atop the division. (For those of you who don't get that – the Washington Commanders are a football team.... Well, they're ***kinda*** a **football team**...)

But more seriously – *not* just in **sports** reporting, but in *all* the ways we **receive** and **process** information, it's **almost impossible** to discern **what is "fact**" and **what is "spin."** The internet is populated with "deep fakes" and **purposeful manipulations** of how we perceive the world around us. We really don't know **which end** is **up**!

And the effect of our information being unreliable – is that we start to doubt our foundational stories: The story of the American Dream has been turned upside-down. The idea that, *though* we'll hit rough patches along the way, we are generally on an upward trajectory – this is now in doubt: For the first time in American history, *this* generation of young adults, when polled, do not believe that they will have it better off than their parents. This breeds uncertainty, futility, and even unkindness to one another – on a personal level, and on a global level.

Global friendships and alliances are upside-down, as well: *[TAP CHEST]* We are guilty of inverting who our friends are, and who our enemies are. Can you imagine the evil dictators and Fuhrers of past generations eulogized in the media as "charismatic orators" - ?! This was said of Nasrallah, the head of Hizballah. Nasrallah was responsible for the deaths of hundreds of Americans AND Israelis, people of all backgrounds – not to mention the way he victimized his *own* people. Our same enemies call for the death of our ally Israel, and in the same breath, call out "Death to America." As Elie Wiesel said, "When someone says they want to kill you, *believe them*." We should *believe* their murderous intentions, *not* explain their words away, *not* criticize when Israel makes the world a safer place, *without* them.

Indeed, Israel's vilification on the world scene and in the media is perhaps the greatest symptom of an upside-down world:

Calling Israel "genocidal" – is upside-down: The Palestinian population has multiplied many times over, *despite* their antagonism and terrorism toward the Jewish State. Iron Dome has protected Arab and Jewish villages alike from rockets. Is there loss of life in *all* war? YES. But the IDF takes efforts to minimize such casualties, *not* to eliminate a people: They offer advance text-message warnings before taking out the rockets and weaponry, that are stored in Palestinian homes and mosques.

The **reporting** on **humanitarian aid** is *also* **upside-down**: Try to recall a war when the **more powerful side warned** their less-powerful attackers, and the civilians among them, *where to go* to access a **safer humanitarian corridor**... Was there ever a war where **one side** was **responsible** for **delivering humanitarian aid** to the other side?! Israel has facilitated almost a *million tons* of aid – some **3000 calories per Gazan**, *if only* **Hamas** did *not* **steal** the food and fuel and medical supplies from their own people. *Hamas* are the **persecutors**, but they are given a **free pass**, in this **upside-down world**.

Calling Israel "apartheid" is *also* **upside-down**: **Arab citizens** are **represented** in K'nesset, in the Supreme Court, in all professions, in the Army... Is there **work to be done** to reach **full equality? YES** – but **what nation** on earth DOESN'T have **such work** to be done? Can we, *here*, really **throw the first stone** when it comes to equal opportunity and outcomes? Israel is **not perfect** – but does it make sense that the United Nations condemns Israel at more than **double the rate** of **all other countries**, *combined*?! Maybe, *more likely*, the **UN** is **upside-down** – that they have **eaten** of the proverbial "**tainted wheat**" in the Reb Nachman story, and WE are just trying to **hold it together** until the **next harvest**?!

So *too*, it is **upside-down**, **false** and **deceptive**, to call Israel "**imperialist**, **colonialists**." When the **world partitioned** the British Empire's mandate in 1947, offering a Jewish State *and* an Arab State in Israel, it actually **REVERSED 1900 years of imperialism**, *against the* Jews. The Jews accepted this plan, the Arabs chose war – and have chosen war over a dozen other times that Israel and the world offered homelands for the Palestinian People. Calling a Jewish People *returning* to *part of* its ancestral homeland – calling *that* "colonialist" is... you guessed it, **upside-down!**

And perhaps the **WORST "upside-down**" deception is the one that, this year, **fueled** the **antisemitic animus** on **college** campuses, against Jewish students and professors (regardless of their Israel politics).

I am speaking of the **upside-down**, false binary: That one is *EITHER* oppressed – and therefore blameless, not responsible... <u>OR else</u> one must be the oppressor – powerful, and therefore, by definition, evil. This false binary of oppressed vs. oppressor has labeled and libeled Israel ever since we had the temerity – the *chutzpah* – to actually *succeed* at building a Jewish State, against all odds.

I *understand* why people like an **underdog**; I'm a huge **Eagles fan**, and I still smile about the Super Bowl season. I understand how much of the Jewish Story has been **defined** by "David vs. Goliath." But I don't want us to over-romanticize the idea of a **disempowered underdog**. Yes, I want us to be **hungry**, to strive, to **push ourselves** to be better, to go *beyond* what we thought was possible. But I'd much rather be *secure* in the goodness of the world, and in the goodness of those who are powerful.

The **REAL Jewish lesson** of **David and Goliath** is that being **threatened** and being **strong** are <u>*not*</u> **mutually exclusive**, that the **either-or** of the **underdog oppressed versus** the **powerful oppressor** is a **false dichotomy**.

But the *worst* part of the **upside-down**, **false-dichotomy** world of the saintly oppressed versus the powerful oppressor: It is a **vision** for a **TERRIBLE WORLD**! I **don't** *want* **to live** in a world where the **good are powerless**, and *just barely survive*!

I don't want to define power as automatically evil -NO! I want GOOD to be POWERFUL, AND to use our POWER for GOOD! Join me in that vision for the world, will you? It is a relief to me that, even if our world is upside-down right now... Most of the time, we live in a world where the GOOD side is stronger!

That's why we **need** to **call it out** – to *SEE* that the world is upside-down right now, that this is a **Yom** K'Purim – a time more like the **upended world** of **Purim**. And **therefore**, to **plead** for a **world** *desperately* **in need** of a **Yom HaKippurim**, a **Yom Kippur**, to **re-stabilize** us.

We have to be **clear-headed**, **purposeful**, about just **what** is **upside-down**, **what needs righting** – because we cannot ignore the **ramifications** of **obfuscating**, **confusing**, and **accepting** an upended world. It is a **purposeful blindness** to the **immediate** and **unavoidable** and **disastrous consequences** of **inverting good and evil**. Judaism has a **folksy law** to **counter** this – called *psik reishei* – which means, "if you **cut off the head** of the chicken, you **cannot say** you **'didn't mean'** for it to **die**." *Similarly*, you can't say, "**Give back** the **Philadelphi corridor**, the main way that **Hamas smuggles arms**" and *THEN* say, "Oh, I **didn't** *MEAN* that Hamas should be **allowed to re-arm** and **plan** the next October 7." That, too, is **upside-down logic** – to **refuse to see** the **natural**, **logical**, **automatic consequences** of our **actions** or **advice** or **demands** of our friends and allies, *Acheinu*, our People.

But here's the good news: <u>If</u> we see, if we call out the consequences, a world upside-down, like Purim, we can then right this wrong. On Yom Kippur, according to tradition, Moses comes down Mount Sinai with the second set of tablets of the Ten Commandments. Remember, he smashed the first set when he saw that we had turned our world, our relationship with God... upside-down – by building and worshiping a Golden Calf. Moses goes back up the mountain to figure out what to do with us, when we've turned the Covenant upside-down. And it's not until

TODAY, Yom Kippur, that Moses comes down Mount Sinai with the *second* set of tablets of the Ten Commandments, and we re-affirm the covenant, we set the world aright.

Are there modern-day Golden Calves upending us, now? *[TAP CHEST]* For the sin, the idolatry, of going astray, believing the lies and libels of those who seek to harm us.... For the sin, the idolatry, of misleading *ourselves* and others.... YES – these are enticing, self-destructive idolatries!

But on Yom Kippur – We get the second set of tablets. We pick up the broken pieces of the first tablets – we collect ourselves, our brokenness... and we start to rebuild – more AWARE of the stakes, of the threats we face, than ever before. Leading up to October 7, 2023, Israel was vulnerable, fractured, and *[TAP CHEST]* too self-assured when it came to defense on the Gaza border. And *here*, we *too* got too comfortable, ignoring or explaining away the growing antisemitism and antagonism – in a way that, *history teaches us*, often leads to the world peeling back the façade of safety and power...

Now, the scab is off, the wound is still there: Our nightmare, our shock, when a pogrom in Israel was celebrated in the quads of universities and the streets of cities.... People and Peoples we *thought* were allies and friends – but who, in a world upside-down, turned away from us.

What gives us our voice to call out a world upside-down? A strong Israel. An Israel that sees its mission to ally with us against antisemitism (*I've shared before - when I went to Israel twice this year*, *Israelis asked how about WE are coping*, as Jews in America!)...

Israel is **not** the **cause** of **antisemitism** – that is *not only* **upside-down**, but really, it's **Jewish self-hatred** to say that **Israel causes antisemitism**. Rather, Israel is the **only viable RESPONSE** to **antisemitism**! It gives us a **strong Jewish voice** – even when we sometimes **use that voice** (*as Israelis DO*!) to **criticize** a **given government** or **policy**

We *NEED* Purim, to see our world with clear eyes, and to plan our resurgence; Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks once reflected about Purim: "A people that can know the full darkness of history and yet rejoice is a people whose spirit no power on Earth can ever break."

Purim is the moment when we **laugh**, and we recognize that the **world** is **upside-down**... And <u>now</u>, Yom Kippur, is the moment when we get **serious** about **turning** it **back**, **right-side-up!** We do **not** use it as **proof** of our **downfall**, but as **proof** of our resilience! Of our **timelessness**. Of our **secret sauce** for our **survival**. We **take** a **world** on its **head** – k'PURIM - and we **set it aright**, **again**... **one act of goodness**... one **STONE**, at a time.... **Reaffirming** that **Covenant**, at the **VERY MOMENT** we are **most vulnerable**, **most insecure**, **most in doubt** – as **Americans** and *certainly* as **Jews**.

The world is upside-down – but like my feeble headstand attempt, and even like Ben Gurion, who was better at it than I am – the world cannot stay on its head forever.

Like the King and his advisor, eating the only untainted wheat – we *WILL* reach a day when we look at one another – or look in the spiritual mirror - in order to see the mark that reminds us: THIS reality is NOT OKAY. And it DOES *NOT* have to stay this way, *this "not-okay.*" In a world that is spinning out of control, a world that is upside-down – it is our job to call that out... to start to fix it, to be the light unto other nations and other humans.... And *someday*, whenever a new harvest comes along, allowing *others* to break through the fog and the perverse, mental bondage of this collective insanity, may we *all* eat *new* bread, that lets us see a better way...

Where GOOD overpowers EVIL, where HOPE vanquishes HATE and despair, where FAITH in a better world puts us on the path to that better world. We put a Yom Kippur on the calendar each year – so that we can *see* the world of Purim, see it as crazy, as in need of fixing, of righting – and then, *slowly*, start to "rightside-up it." One pebble at a time *[SHOW]*, we start to solidify the ground under our feet.

[Sing, softly] Mi-Yom Kippurim zeh, ad Yom Kippurim ha-bah aleinu – from this Yom Kippur, to the next, when we pick ourselves up and do the work again... [Sing, softly] l'tovah. – May we bring goodness back to a world that is, by next year, a little more tov, a little more righted, a little more righted. AMEN.
